After the classroom training, the County First Ladies chose a project to undertake in their County, based on the needs of their communities. It is this project that they showcase as part of the peer-to-peer learning. The former First Lady, Her Excellency Margaret Kenyatta, presided over the showcasing of First ladies from five Counties, namely: Makueni, Marsabit, Siaya, Kajiado and Migori. Other First Ladies that attended this occasion were: Nairobi, Uasin Gishu, and Nyandarua.

The showcase featured interactive sessions, including presentations by H.E. Dr. Agnes Ochilo (Migori County), which

highlighted interventions in managing sickle cell anemia; H.E. Mrs. Anita Mutula (Makueni County) shared efforts in cancer screening and community health promotion; while H.E. Prof. Betty Murungi (Siaya County) presented on Early Childhood Development initiatives. H.E. Mrs. Edna Chelangat Lenku (Kajiado County) spoke about her achievements in the eco-friendly Manyatta housing initiative, and H.E. Alamitu Jattani (Marsabit County) outlined ongoing campaigns against female genital mutilation.

The aim of showcasing the County First Ladies project is not only for a peer- to- peer learning, but it is also an opportunity to find collaborations with other partners and mobilize resources for their county projects. Some of those partners that were present for this occasion included Ford Foundation and the Rockefeller Foundation.
